



## Membership FAQs

### Frequently Asked Questions

**Q1: What is membership at PCC?**

A1: Church membership is more than joining a civic organization or country club—it's about joining a family of believers on mission! Membership doesn't simply have privileges; it is a privilege.

Becoming a member at PCC means you have received Jesus as your Lord and Savior, and have been, or intend to be, baptized as a believer. You are also committing to our Membership Covenant, which you can review at [pccwired.net/membership-covenant](http://pccwired.net/membership-covenant).

**Q2: What if I've never been baptized? Can I still sign the membership covenant?**

A2: Yes, and we will hold this document until you've been baptized. Then, the pastor will sign it. But you don't have to wait for baptism or the membership covenant to get involved on the Dream Team or in a small group.

**Q3: Does PCC transfer membership from my previous church?**

A3: If you'd like us to write a letter to let your church know that you've joined PCC, then we'd be glad to do that. Some churches will then 'transfer' your membership to us, but it's not a requirement on our end. You can become a member simply by attending Growth Track and signing the Membership Covenant.

**Q4: What if I was baptized as a kid? Or, what if I was sprinkled, not dunked?**

A4: Then we'd love to talk with you about baptism! There's nothing wrong with being baptized as a child or sprinkled. However, there's a difference between your parent(s) choosing those important rituals for you and you making your own informed decision when you're of age. What matters to us is that you decide, as a believer in Jesus, to hand your life over to Him and follow Him for the rest of your life.

**Q5: I'm not giving 10% right now; can I still join?**

A5: Absolutely. If you can't start with 10%, then we suggest setting a place to start and working toward 10% at a pace that's right for you. Our tithing challenge is also a great option that has been transformative for many working towards tithing. **Q6: Can I volunteer without being a member?**

A6: Of course! As a volunteer, you represent PCC, so even if you're not a member, we have systems and training in place to make sure you feel comfortable in representing our church.

A7: Yes! This is a serious commitment, and it's okay to take some time to make sure you want to make it.
